

USAMMDA INFORMATION PAPER

PRODUCT: WARRIOR MEDIC

DESCRIPTION: The Warrior Medic (WM) system is being developed in response to the need to reduce the time between the occurrence and treatment of battlefield casualties, and increase medical situational awareness. The WM system is an enhancement to PEO Soldier's Land Warrior System. It consists of the Land Warrior Leader configuration, excluding the Weapons Subsystem, with enhancements including electronic casualty reporting for all soldiers, and access to applicable electronic medical field manuals. It leverages the Land Warrior Program to enable wounded warfighters, or their buddies, to instantaneously send an emergency "Call for Medic" message with location to both the Combat Medic and Commander, greatly enhancing survivability.

PROGRAM RELEVANCE to the ARMY: This product supports both the core mission of the Army and the Army Campaign Plan. Of the Army's core competencies, this product supports "Prompt Response," "Forcible Entry Operations," and "Sustained Land Dominance." This program is an enhancement to the Land Warrior Program, the U.S. Army's first-generation, integrated soldier system for increasing the effectiveness of tactical command and control, situation awareness, fightability and survivability of the dismounted soldier. This product supports Future Operational Capabilities: MD-02-001 Clearing The Battlefield and MD-02-003 Medical Force Protection.

ISSUES/ACTIONS:

- Land Warrior Block I program has been terminated due to cable reliability issues.
- Block II development is ongoing.
- First Unit Equipped date has been pushed out to 4QFY06.
- Warrior Medic requirements have been integrated into the Land Warrior System.
- Monitor the Land Warrior program to ensure the system is fielded.
- Obtain contract deliverables when available; e.g., two Land Warrior systems so the Army Medical Department (AMEDD) can develop doctrine and train medics how to interpret and act on the situational awareness information they will receive.
